Father, son electrocuted, woman injured in Telangana

**Bhadrachalam (Telangana):** In a tragic incident, two people, a father and son, died due to electrocution, and a woman sustained injuries in Yellapuram village of Illandur Mandal in Bhadrachali Kothagudem district in the early hours today. According to police reports, Erramma (50) received an electric shock after accidentally coming into contact with a broken live wire. In an attempt to save her, her husband Enugu Narasiah (55) and their son Praveen (30) rushed to her aid but were fatally electrocuted on the spot.

Flash flood alert in 5 Himachal districts

**Shimla:** The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a flash flood guidance bulletin warning of low to moderate flash flood risk across select areas of Chamba, Kangra, Mandi, Shimla, and Sirmour districts in Himachal Pradesh over the next 24 hours. The alert, issued by the IMD's Hydromet Division, covers the period till 11:30 AM on June 26, citing the likelihood of intense rainfall over a few watersheds and vulnerable neighborhoods. The bulletin highlights the possibility of surface runoff and inundation in some fully saturated and low-lying areas due to expected rainfall.

NHRC notice to UP top cops in jail custody deaths

**New Delhi:** The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) today said it has taken suo motu cognisance of the reported deaths of three prisoners in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh. The top rights body has issued notices to the state's Director General of Prisons and the District Police Commissioner, calling for a detailed report within two weeks. The report is expected to include the inquest and post-mortem examination reports, the initial health screening details of all three prisoners, as well as the magisterial enquiry reports, said the NHRC in a statement here.

Three women killed, four injured in road accident

**Phagwara:** A tragic road accident near the village of Chhichhowal on the Phillaur-Nawanshahr highway claimed the lives of three women, all belonging to a single family, and left four others, including a child, seriously injured today. The collision occurred between an autorickshaw and a speeding Xylo car, reportedly coming from the wrong side of the road. According to eyewitnesses and the injured autorickshaw driver, he was transporting passengers from the village of Jhandapeer to Phillaur when the accident occurred.

Fire in Mumbai commercial building; no injury

**Mumbai:** A fire broke out today early this morning at the Windsor Building located on CST Road, Santacruz (East) in city suburb with no injury reported. According to fire bridge sources, the fire was confined to electric wiring, electric installation, furniture, server panel, panel battery, office records, etc.in an area about 1000-1500 sq feet in RMC office on 7th floor. The fire was brought under control within an hour with no injuries or casualties reported.

Cabinet approves Rs 5,940 cr revised Jharia Master Plan

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi today approved the revised Jharia Master Plan (JMP) for addressing issues related to fire, land subsidence, and rehabilitation of affected families in the Jharia coalfield. The total financial outlay for the implementation of the revised plan is Rs 5,940.47 crore. The phase wise approach shall ensure that handling of fire and subsidence and rehabilitation of the affected families will be done on priority basis from the most vulnerable sites, an official statement said.

The revised JMP lays emphasis on sustainable livelihood generation for families being resettled under the plan. Targeted skill devel-

opment programmes are to be undertaken and income-generating opportunities will be created to ensure economic self-reliance of the rehabilitated families.

Furthermore, a livelihood grant of Rs one lakh and access to credit support of up to Rs three lakh through an institutional credit pipeline will be extended to both Legal Title Holder (LTH) families and Non-Legal Title Holder (Non-LTH) families.

In addition, comprehensive infrastructure and essential amenities— such as roads, electricity, water supply, sewerage, schools, hospitals, skill development centres, community halls, and other common facilities—are to be developed at the resettlement sites. These provisions will be implemented as per the recommendations of the committee for implementation of the revised Jharia Master Plan, ensuring a holistic and humane rehabilitation approach.

As part of the livelihood support measures, a dedicated Jharia alternative livelihoods rehabilitation fund is to be established to promote livelihood-related activities. Skill development initiatives will also be carried out in collaboration with Multi Skill Development Institutes operating in the region.

Cabinet nod to set up global potato centre in Agra

**New Delhi:** The Union Cabinet headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given nod to a proposal from the Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare to set up an international potato centre at Agra, Uttar Pradesh. “The major objective of this investment is to increase food and nutrition security, farmers income, and job creation by improving potato and sweetpotato productivity, post-harvest management and value-addition,” Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw told reporters after the Cabinet meeting here. According to the government officials, the potato sector in the country has the potential to generate significant employment opportunities in production sector, processing sector, packaging, transportation, marketing, value chain, etc. Hence, in order to untap and explore the huge potential in this sector, International Potato Centre (CIP)’s south Asia regional Centre is being established at Singna, Agra, Uttar Pradesh, as per the official.

ED confiscated properties of over Rs 636 cr in Bengal school service scam

**Kolkata:** The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has confiscated movable and immovable property of Rs. 27.19 crore belonging to arrested Prasanna Kumar Roy, a middle man, allegedly involved in the West Bengal Central School Service Commission (Group C & D staff) recruitment scam of 2016, official sources said.

The property was held in the name of three tea estates of Prasanna Kumar Roy. The tea estates are Samsing Organic Tea Pvt Ltd, Yangtong Organic Tea Pvt Ltd and Bamanadanga Tea Estate Pvt Ltd. The attached properties consist of bungalows, factories, plants & machineries and a fleet of vehicles.

“These properties were acquired from the cash collected from various undeserving candidates for their illegal appointments to the post of Group-C & D staff,” the ED statement said.

The Supreme Court in an order on April 3 quashed the appointments of more than 25,000 teaching and non-teaching staff by the West Bengal Central SSC terming the entire selection process as vitiated and tainted.

Multi-layered security to make Amarnath Yatra safe: IGP Kashmir

Srinagar (UNI)

With the annual Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra set to begin on July 3, security forces in Jammu and Kashmir have put in place elaborate, multi-layered arrangements to ensure the safety and smooth conduct of the pilgrimage, which draws thousands of devotees to the holy cave shrine located in the Himalayas.

Addressing media after a mock exercise in south Kashmir, Inspector General of Police (IGP) Kashmir, Vidhi Kumar Birdi, said that this year's Yatra will be held under heightened vigilance and deeper security coordination compared to previous years. “As compared to last year, this time we have multi-layered and in-depth security arrangements to make the



Yatra safe and comfortable for the pilgrims,” Birdi said.

To streamline security operations, the entire Yatra security arrangements has been divided into multiple zones and sectors, spanning both the Pahalgam and Baltal tracks. Each zone has a dedicated security layout, and to-day Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) drills were carried out to test readiness and refine emergency response protocols. “The drills have been conducted across the valley, including base camps,

road stretches, interior sections, and other key locations. The aim is to enhance coordination among all security units and ensure that everyone knows their specific responsibilities in case of any contingency,” the IGP explained.

According to officials, the mock drills involved joint participation from J&K Police, Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs), emergency response units, disaster management authorities, medical teams, and traffic regulators. The coordinated simulation exercises focused on quick response, evacuation, and communication efficiency in case of any security threat or natural emergency like landslides or cloud-bursts.

SC to hear Thiruchendur temple priest's plea on July 1 over consecration timing

The Supreme Court today agreed to hear on July 1 a petition filed by the Vidhayahar (chief temple priest) of the historic Arulmigu Subramaniya Swamy temple in Thiruchendur, Tamil Nadu, challenging the Madras High Court's approval of the consecration (Kumbhabhishekam) ceremony timing fixed by an expert committee.

The plea, filed by R. Sivarama Subramaniya Sasthigral, contends that the High Court erred in allowing the ceremony to be



conducted on July 7 between 6 a.m. and 6.47 a.m., as recommended by a court-appointed Agama expert committee.

The petitioner asserts that the auspicious time should be 12.05 p.m. to 12.47 p.m., as fixed by him in his capacity as Vid-

hayahar of the temple.

The matter was mentioned orally before a bench of Justice K V Viswanathan and Justice NK Singh for urgent listing. Justice Viswanathan, upon learning that the temple in question was Thiruchendur's famous Subramaniya Swamy Temple, remarked, “It is a good temple.”

During the exchange, the judge asked if the petitioner had fixed the time last year as well, to which the counsel confirmed and added that even the High Court had previously recognized the Vidhayahar's authori-

ty in such matters.

However, this year, the counsel explained, the High Court had constituted a committee to determine the timing.

Justice Viswanathan, after examining the High Court's order on a digital device presented by counsel, noted that the High Court had specifically directed the temple administration to follow the traditional procedure of seeking written opinions from the Vidhayahar, with clear indication of whether a Pottolai (astrological chart/timing) is a draft or final version.

Traffic restored on Jammu-Srinagar NH, labourer rescued from River Tawi

**Jammu:** The traffic has been restored on the strategic Jammu-Srinagar national highway, while a labourer was rescued from River Tawi in the heart of Jammu City today.

The Jammu-Srinagar national highway was closed early morning when heavy rains triggered a mudslide near Ramban.

“The men and machinery were immediately pressed into service, and the traffic was restored on the highway,” said police.

They said that the stranded vehicles are being cleared.

In a separate incident, a labourer was rescued by the State Disaster Rescue Force (SDRF) team from River Tawi Waters in the Nowabad area.

Landslide cripples rail link in Assam's hill section; NFR at work

Train services in the Lumding-Badarpur Hill section of Assam have come to a halt after a massive landslide triggered by relentless rains damaged nearly 100 metres of railway track, officials said.

The collapse of a slope from the line caused extensive disruption, severing a key

lifeline that connects the Barak Valley with the rest of Assam and the northeastern region.

The Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) has launched a round-the-clock restoration operation to reopen the vital stretch.

More than 25 heavy machines, including JCBs, excavators, and dumpers, are at work, supported by approximately 200 labourers and engineers on the ground. The Divisional Railway Manager of Lumding, along with other senior NFR officials, is directly overseeing the effort, which has been described as a race against time, a statement said.

A high-level coordination meeting was held on June 24 to strategize the restoration plan. It was attended by Assam's Chief Secretary, the General Manager of NFR, and senior officials from the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and other Central agencies.

UP govt inks MoU with NDDB to boost farmers' income and animal husbandry

**Lucknow:** Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath today reaffirmed his government's commitment to increasing the income of milk producers, strengthening rural economies built around livestock, and ensuring high-quality dairy products for consumers.

Speaking at an event, he said, “The Uttar Pradesh government is working with full dedication to make the state's dairy sector self-reliant, technologically equipped, and profitable for farmers.”

The day marked a significant milestone as the Uttar Pradesh Coopera-

tive Dairy Federation (PCDF) signed a crucial MoU with the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) for the operation of three dairy plants in Kanpur, Gorakhpur, and Kanauj, along with a animal feed production facility in Ambedkar Nagar.

With NDDB taking charge of these facilities, new standards of efficiency, transparency, and professionalism will be established. Farmers will also benefit from timely payments, better prices, and stable marketing channels — creating a more sustainable and thriving dairy ecosystem across the state.

Vaccine uptake decline puts millions of children at risk: Lancet report

Globally, millions of kids are at heightened risk of deadly diseases due to stalled or reversed vaccination coverage majorly due to health inequalities, hesitancy and growing misinformation, a report published in The Lancet has warned.

It flagged that global immunisation targets for 2030 as envisioned by the WHO in 2019 through the immunization Agenda will not be achieved without “transformational improvements in equity.”

If major progress in rolling out jabs to billions of children in all corners of the globe over the last five decades has prevented the deaths of 154 million children, since 2010, progress has slowed and, in some areas of the world, reversed, said the report based



on the voluminous data, collected from over 1,000 sources across 204 countries.

Measles vaccination rates have dropped in 100 countries, and 21 of 36 high-income na-

tions, including the US, UK, France, and Japan, have seen declining coverage for essential vaccines such as those for diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, and polio, said the report pub-

lished on Tuesday.

The Covid-19 pandemic disrupted vaccination efforts, further leaving millions of children vulnerable to preventable diseases. Dr. Jonathan Mosser, a lead author of the study, highlighted that despite past successes, significant numbers of children remain either under-vaccinated or not vaccinated at all. In 2023, it pointed out, more than half of the world's 15.7 million unvaccinated children were living in just eight countries including India.

The analysis indicated that accelerated progress will be necessary to achieve the 2030 target of halving the number of zero-dose children compared to 2019 levels, with only 18 of 204 countries and territories estimated to have already met this target as of 2023.

“Two-thirds (65%) of the zero-dose children that need to be reached by vaccination between 2023 and 2030 live in sub-Saharan Africa (4.28 million) and South Asia (1.33 million).”

Country-wise, in Nigeria, 2.48 million children remained unvaccinated followed by India (1.44 million), the Democratic Republic of Congo (882,000), Ethiopia (782,000), Somalia (710,000), Sudan (627,000), Indonesia (538,000), and Brazil (452,000).

The report pointed that vaccine-preventable outbreaks, including measles and polio, are becoming an increasing global concern. Polio cases have surged in Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Papua New Guinea, and Europe saw a tenfold rise in measles cases in 2024.
